Introduction

Located in rural western Kentucky, Trigg County Primary School serves 510 students preschool through second grade. We provide an educational atmosphere that challenges all students to reach their highest academic potential. Due to a 66.21% free/reduced rate (K - 2), we are a school-wide Title I program. The closing of our largest manufacturing business, Johnson Control, both our school and community provides assistance through our Family Resource Center, Early Childhood Council, PTA, RSVP program, and local civic organizations to promote academic growth and eliminate educational barriers for our students. Even though our community has a high rate of retired citizens, they support our innovative programming, celebration of academic success, instructional resources, volunteering to read and many other aspects of our school. Due to the low economic rate and being located near Fort Campbell Army Base, our families are transit. Therefore our staff provides classroom interventions and Response to Intervention program immediately to increase academic skills in weak areas. Trigg County Primary has a daily attendance rate of 96.69%. Our staff exhibits a diversity of talent with four National Board Certified Teachers, regional cadre membership, state-wide innovative programming and a 16:1 ratio of student to teacher. Using several formative assessments (AIMSweb, MAP, Common), we foster activities that are aligned with the Kentucky Core Academic Standards and integrate differentiated instructional practices.

School's Purpose

During the 2015-2016 summer professional development, our staff reviewed our thoughts concerning our vision, mission and values. This will continue with the contribution of parents and community to move Trigg County Primary School to the 21st century. With providing instruction in communication, collaboration, creativity and critical thinking (4Cs), implementing a design thinking model, training in Project Based Learning and establishing Standard Based Grading, a new focus has been created for our vision, mission and values.

Currently, Trigg County Primary School's vision is an educational environment where students learn skills and are supported by teachers, staff, parents and the community to build dreams and to reach goals. Our motto is "We are all stars".

Trigg County Primary School's mission is to educate all students academically and socially in a safe, non-threatening environment. Through the shared involvement of our parents, students, school family and community, our students will be provided with diverse learning opportunities to help them become independent learners.

Our values are (STAR)

Smile and be positive

Treat others with kindness

Accept responsibility

Trigg County Primary School embodies our mission, vision, and values through our variety of programming and school expectations. We try to ensure a safe school environment, academic focus for students, and intervention programs to reach their highest potential at Trigg County Primary School.

Using our school-wide Positive Behavior Intervention System (PBIS) and the CHAMPS program, that are monitored by our Safe School committee monthly and providing weekly positive awards with our Wildcat Den, we will see an increase of positive behavior throughout our Preschool - Second Grade program. School-wide CHAMPS has provided teachers with consistent, research-based interventions to use with all of our students. During the PBIS, Safe School Committee's monthly meetings, data is examined and suggestions are offered for teachers to monitor. Our school also has Behavioral Targeted Assistance and Growth (Rtl) program that provides research-based programs and weekly monitoring for our Tier 2 and Tier 3 students. Students of good character can become student ambassadors though completing a resume and providing two references. Student ambassadors are selected each nine weeks and are trained in communication skills so they can greet guests, state learning targets and provide strong examples of student work. This allows our students leadership positions in each classroom.

In a proactive move to focus on academic growth from birth to entering Kindergarten, we offer the United Way BornLearning Academy, Ready, Set, Kindergarten and PLAYschool. These programs are family centered with hands-on activities. With help from our community, Imagination Library books, Magic Math Kits and other materials are given to all families. Through mini-sessions of targeted school readiness skills, our staff uses modeling, parent/child talk, art projects, gross motor movement, social/emotional development strategies and other techniques to increase parent/child teaching. Using the KY Brigance Screener, our kindergarten teachers provide classroom interventions to increase readiness skills.

Interventions can be seen in all classrooms such as: Reading Eggs, Mathseeds, IXL, EducationCity, Brain Pop, Jr. and other technology websites. An instructional flow chart shows other interventions used daily in classrooms preschool through the second grade.

Another resource is our volunteers and RSVP personnel; they provide a weekly one on one session or small group session to improve

reading fluency and comprehension.

We also use daytime ESS personnel which allows certified, retired teachers to return and assist in the classroom with small group and one on one direct instruction.

Our Academic Targeted Assistance and Growth (RtI) provides research-based, scientific interventions that are monitored weekly or twice weekly. The academic TAG committee meets monthly to determine if progress is occurring with the student and analyze the data to improve our students' weak areas. Each Tier 2 or Tier 3 Academic TAG students have their own data charted on AIMSweb program and examined regularly by the school. Classroom teachers met twice a year with the TAG committee to examine data, discuss progress and review interventions being used in the regular classroom.

The school and community celebrate academic success with assistance from the Cadiz Rotary Club providing awards. Each classroom chooses a student to be awarded monthly in the areas of reading, math, and most improved. All classroom teachers monitor using formative assessments and then provide individual interventions to increase academic growth. We have also started monitoring and celebrating teacher and student attendance in a much more intentional way. We all know that students must be present for learning to occur so we have encouraged attendance through school-wide recognition, nine weeks awards for perfect attendance, and much more. This has proven to be effective as our daily attendance has increased consistently since school started.

Notable Achievements and Areas of Improvement

Trigg County Primary School (Pre - 2) students transition into Trigg County Intermediate School beginning in the third grade. We are two schools located in one building. Trigg County Intermediate School has scored proficient and making progress for the last two years of the K-Prep assessment. This is the third year of implementing district-wide assessment, MAP, last year 59% of our students reached the end of the year target in reading and 57% in math. Our highest score in reading was foundational skills and in mathematics, our highest score was geometry. Our areas of improvement were language and writing for reading and algebraic thinking in mathematics.

Starting this year after Fall MAP assessment, our SBDM council examined the similarities and differences in each subcategory of MAP. Teachers and TAG committee met to plan interventions and in class monitoring of progress to assist their students. Our teachers will continue their professional development in descriptive feedback, PBL, Standard Based Grading, 4Cs and Personalized Learning. The teachers are implementing the new science standards and creating small PBL units and activities for deeper learning of subject matter. Monthly professional development is implemented with our "Want to Know More" sessions. Teachers provide the suggestions for this monthly professional development to assist them with their PGES or other areas of improvement.

Trigg County Primary School is striving to shift the pedagogy in the classroom. Our three year plan is to strive to develop a school of Next Generation Learners and 21st Century thinkers. We will implement a design thinking process to be used by all teachers. Our professional development action plan will create units using the Four C's (critical thinking, creativity, communication, collaboration), will development problem/project based learning, will implement personalized learning in pilot classrooms and will evaluate student achievement through standard based grading. To improve instruction in the classroom our professional development action plan must also include continued learning of formative assessment strategies, program review implementation, descriptive feedback, differentiation, individualization, personalization, and revising curriculum.

Data Reviewed: MAP and AimsWeb

Student Performance Data: Trigg County Primary School Reading MAP data reveals, based on the 2015-2016 fall data, only 50.4% of our students school-wide are in the 50th percentile or higher. Our Math MAP reveals, based on the 2015-2016 fall data, only 46.4% of our students school-wide are in the 50th percentile or higher. Our AimsWeb reading fluency data tells us that 49.1% of our students school-wide are in the 50th percentile or higher based on the 2015-2016 fall data. TELL Survey Data: Based on our most current TELL Survey Data (2014-2015 survey results), our school has identified the areas of strength and areas for improvement as determined by the teacher responses. One area of strength was . It was noted this is done consistently in a timely manner. Another strength identified was related to professional development as an ongoing process for teacher improvement. One area of improvement identified was related to communication with staff and community. Another area of improvement was related to the process of collaboration to improve school instruction and culture. Non-Academic Indicators: Average daily attendance at Trigg County Primary School is 96.69%. Our school serves a diverse population in relation to cultural experiences, economic status, and adult literacy exposure. Missing Piece - Engagement Survey Data: Process Used to Develop CSIP: At Trigg County Primary School, all teachers serve on at least one school level committee. The assignments are made based on individual area of interest/strength and ensure representation across grade levels. Each committee is given a list of responsibilities during the summer and told to meet with their committees monthly to work towards their specific charge. Our school-wide CSIP committee is made up of various teachers and parents with an interest in the development and implementation of our school level plan. The team meets to discuss the goals set last year and to review data to determine the current identified areas of concern and strength for our school. At this time, the goals are developed as well as objectives, strategies, and activities needed to be successful. After the draft is created, the CSIP is shared with the whole staff to ensure all stakeholders a level of involvement in the decision making process. Modifications are made as needed and the updated draft is presented to the Site-Based Decision Making Council. If any changes are suggested, those are addressed. At this point, the council will vote to approve the CSIP as is and the final copy is again distributed to all stakeholders.

Areas of Strengths

What were the areas of strength you noted? What actions are you implementing to sustain the areas of strength? What is there cause to celebrate?

Based on NWEA our areas of strength are:

Reading - Vocabulary

Math - Geometry

Our reading data shows an increase in vocabulary school-wide. It also shows a strong foundation of reading beginning in our kindergarten classrooms. The use of the Foundation research-based program is working for the majority of our students. Students are increasing their understanding and usage of vocabulary but still struggle with language and writing development. Therefore our students can sound out words quickly, have a nice understanding of the words they are reading. Our math data shows a strength in geometry as well as number and operations. We have recently adopted a school-wide program for consistent math instruction that allows for deeper core content knowledge. It also ensures that students are exposed to multiple ways to solve a problem in order to build their capacity with quick math strategies that best suit their learning styles. With that being said, we have a more clear focus on the importance of depth in math instruction which we anticipate will continue to help us show improvement.

Opportunities for Improvement

What were areas in need of improvement? What plans are you making to improve the areas of need?

Based on NWEA data:

Reading - Language and Writing

Math - Operations and Algebraic Thinking

Our students are strong in vocabulary usage but need training in how to plan and organize their writing. Within the next year, we must increase the amount of language and writing professional development that is offered for all teachers. We need to continue to utilize our Dolch/Fry words and increase the consistency of this usage from class to class and grade to grade. We need to continue to analyze comprehension for our students when faced with long, rigorous passages of reading which can be analyzed through MAP and we need to focus on student understanding and usage of the writing process. One piece of information that is not referenced in this data would be the drastic change in testing design from first to second grade. Our kindergarten and first grade students are read every question and answer selection for each question. When transitioning to second grade, students are required to read all passages, questions, and answers independently. Another concern not shown in the data relates to the reality that our kindergarten students have never taken this type of assessment and some of their scores may not reflect their true ability because of this.

Our math scores were lowest in operations and algebraic thinking in kindergarten and first grade, while second grade showed a lower score in measurement and data. At this time, we need to continue to focus on vocabulary to help with the foundation of mathematics for all students. Our students also need to increase their understanding in algebraic thinking which is an excellent correlation to Next Generations Learners and the TPGES, as both focus on problem solving and real world application of skills and concepts taught. Professional Learning Communities will need to continue their focus on vocabulary for understanding and also to examine strategies and best practice in order to increase algebraic thinking. We also need to make sure to keep the lines of communication open from grade to grade to increase the readiness of our students as they exit one grade and enter the next. As

stated with reading, there is a significant testing shift from first to second grade that the data does not tell. Students have to read all questions and answer choices independently for the first time with the 2nd grade assessment. Also, our kindergarten students are taking the test for the first time in the fall and may not always reflect their ability levels as much as testing procedures and practice. Also, our 2nd grade teachers do not cover measurement and data until the 2nd semester which usually shows an increase in overall understanding, as some of the information has simply not been taught yet.

Conclusion

Reflect on your answers provided in the previous sections. What are your next steps in addressing areas of concern?

Our next steps are to continue to guide, model, and coach teachers in the areas that are a concern. We need to address more intentional planning and teaching through our Professional Development, PLC conversations, walk-through data, etc. We will also continue to grow in our usage of differentiation as well as personalization in order to really target the individual needs of each student.

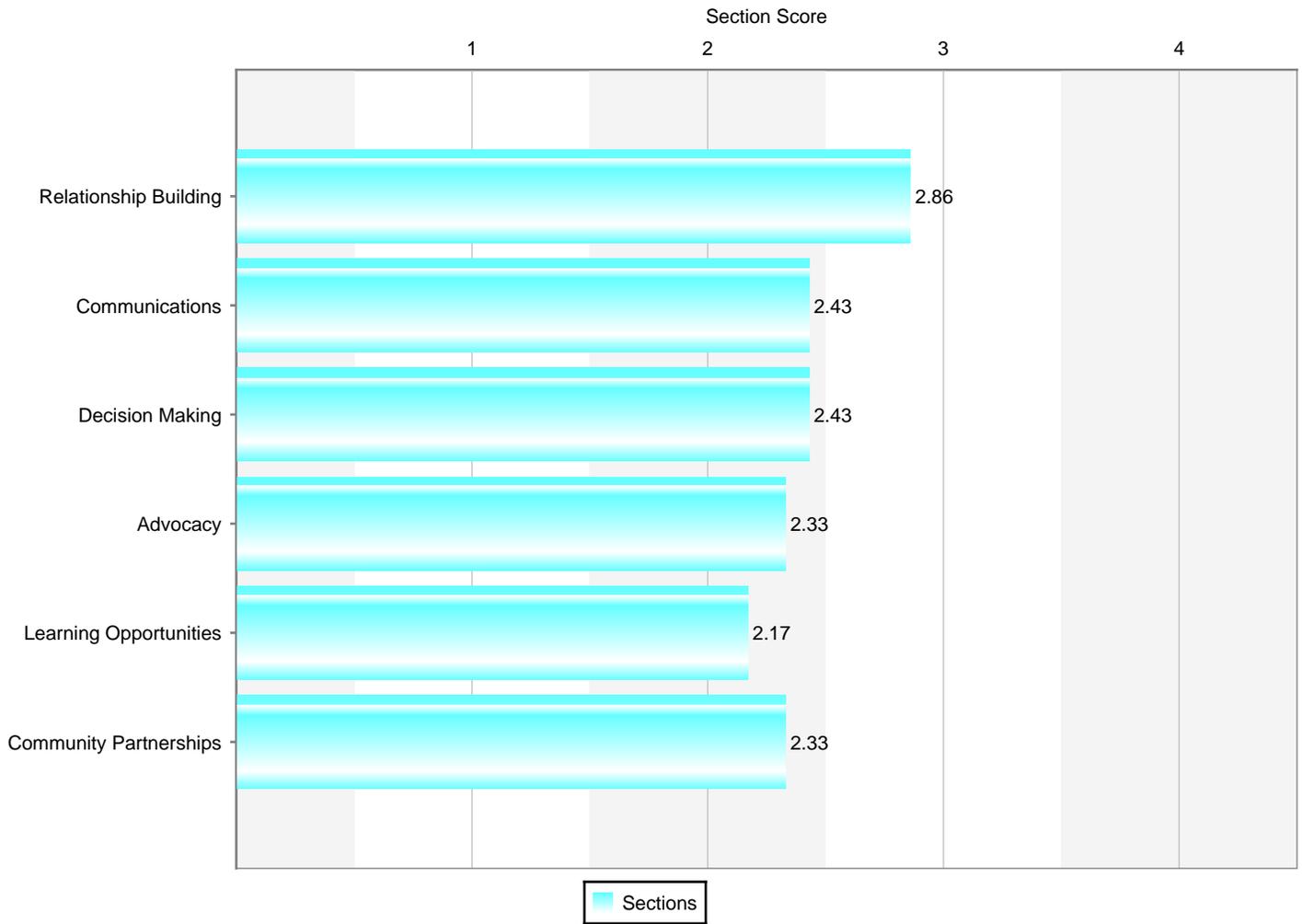
Reflection

When analyzing our results of The Missing Piece, our overall highest score appeared in the area of "relationship building". This is an area of strength for our school as our parents understand they are actively welcomed when they visit the school. They also report that school staff understand and demonstrate how strong relationships with parents contribute to effective teaching and learning. We will continue to maintain strong relationships with our parents, as this is a direct correlation to the success of our children. In the area of "relationship building" we will continue to improve our focus on individual student needs and progress for all children. When analyzing our results of The Missing Piece, the lowest overall score appeared in the area of "learning opportunities". We offer a variety of opportunities for our parents to participate in decision making at the school level. Opportunities are also available to discuss student achievement and strategies to increase parental understanding of child development. In the past several years, we have offered a variety of convenient locations to help parents develop skills in supporting their children's learning with minimal success. In order to improve in this area, we will continue to utilize feedback from parents, staff, and community members to increase involvement in the activities that are offered.

We strive to involve all staff and parents at some point during the CSIP development. A committee is created before the school year begins that outlines the job responsibilities for each. The committees are selected based on those that have an interest in the particular area, a certain skill set, or an enthusiasm to learn in a specific arena. All staff are made aware of their final committee placements before the school year begins. Each team also is composed of parent members based on parent feedback at the beginning of the year. We always invite our parents to participate in our committees based on their interest level. After we receive feedback from parents, each committee makes contact with those interested to discuss available dates and times to meet. Our meetings tend to work around the schedule that best suits our parents so that all are able to be involved. The committee then reviews and modifies the current year CSIP as needed, with administrative assistance. The draft is presented to the staff to increase stakeholder involvement and any suggestions are notes and changed as appropriate. At this point, the CSIP is presented to SBDM for final approval before being complete.

As stated our CSIP committee is responsible for the initial modification with administrative support. The committee is made up of a teacher from each grade level as well as specialty areas and parents. Their responsibility is to review the data provided (TELL survey, MAP, Aimsweb) and ensure the goals and objectives presented on the plan mirror the strengths and areas of improvement evident in the data. A survey is also presented to all staff and all parents to increase feedback and help ensure our plan is addressing the current needs of our school.

Explain how the final improvement plan was communicated to all stakeholders, and the method and frequency in which stakeholders receive information on its progress.

After the CSIP committee has reviewed all data points and made any modifications needed to the plan, it is presented to all staff for any additional questions, comments, or concerns. The process is reviewed with all staff and a window is determined to ensure all stakeholders feel they have the time needed to offer suggestions. After this the CSIP is presented to SBDM for final approval. Once the CSIP is in place, our committee continues to meet monthly to discuss progress on all activities listed. At this time, we are able to add progress notes and keep notes of changes that may need to be made in the future. This information will be shared with all staff and parents twice a year (February and May) to update all stakeholders of the progress and collect any feedback necessary for future decisions. We will also send a survey at the end of the year to ensure the effectiveness of our processes to know how to increase involvement for the next school year.

School Safety Report

Equitable Access Diagnostic

Introduction

As part of No Child Left Behind (NCLB) each state is required to develop strategies to ensure that poor and minority children are not taught at higher rates than other children by inexperienced, unqualified, or out-of-field teachers. The results of this effort became a national push to ensure all teachers were highly qualified (HQT); meaning each teacher holds the appropriate certification for the content and/or grade level for which they are assigned. National data show that poor and minority continue to be taught by inexperienced, unqualified, or out-of-field teachers. As a result, in 2014, the United States Department of Education (USDOE) required states to develop equity plans and use evidence based strategies to address this issue. The focus of the plan is to move away from the concept of “highly qualified” to “high effective”.

This data has been compared with the 2013 data to determine growth in specific areas and the next steps to improve the barriers to achieve equitable access to effective educators.	

What are the barriers identified?

After examining the school report card the areas of work conditions and overall effectiveness of school teachers and leaders, data shows our school agreement percentages were higher than the district or state average. In recruitment, hiring and placement information shows that approximately 40 candidates apply for a general education position in our school. Once they are hired our percentage of teacher turnover is 15.4% lower than the state and district levels.

Our barriers shows in the TELL survey under professional development: * In this school, follow up is provided from professional development (76.9 % agree); * Teachers have sufficient training to fully utilize instructional technology (77.8% agree); and Professional development provides ongoing opportunities for teachers to work with colleagues to refine teaching practices (82.1% agree). Other barriers from the TELL survey shows lack of resources and lack of appropriate level of influence on decision making in our school. Therefore our barriers are related to the category of working conditions.

What sources of data were used to determine the barriers?

TELL Survey (2015), School Report Card and District Academic Data (MAP, AIMSweb and formative assessments)

What are the root causes of those identified barriers?

* Our school must ensure that ongoing, job-embedded professional development strategies must be systematically provided to all teachers but especially our new teachers.

* Time must be provided to practice new strategies and to evaluate their effectiveness with our students.

* Technology training must be utilized and expanded for instruction. This will take additional training for our new teachers concerning programs and websites used at Trigg County Primary School.

* Committees must work effectively providing everyone with a voice in decision making.

What does the Professional Growth and Effectiveness System data say about the effectiveness of teachers in the school?

Our data shows that our teachers are accomplished in most areas (99.0% district).

Equitable Access Strategies

Placement: Describe school policies or procedures that address the assignment of students to ensure low income and minority students are not assigned to inexperienced, ineffective or out-of-field teachers more often than their peers who are not identified as low income or minority students.

Our SBDM student placement policy states: "The principal and teachers on each team will determine the assignments of students to classes on their team, keeping in mind the appropriate teacher/pupil ratio, boy/girl ratio, ethnic ratio, special education, Title I programs, gifted education, socio-economical and the legal guidelines for programs." All teachers are highly qualified with two teachers proceeding through KTIP this year.

Placement: How is data used to make student assignment decisions to ensure low income, minority, Limited English Proficient and Exceptional Children and Youth are not assigned to inexperienced, ineffective or out-of-field teachers more often than their peers?

All aspects of data are reviewed as class lists are created before the beginning of the school year. At the end of each year, teachers complete paperwork that summarizes their scores with various benchmark assessments as well as any other identifying factors necessary for placement. This data is used by building administrators to determine classroom assignments.

Recruitment and Retention: How does the school analyze student level data to design targeted recruitment of effective and diverse teachers?

All aspects of school culture and data are analyzed when determining teacher hiring and recruitment. We have to continue to work on strategies to ensure retention of qualified teachers.

Recruitment and Retention: How does the school recruit teachers who are effective in implementing practices that are targeted to support the diverse learning needs of minority students, low income students, Limited English Proficient and Exceptional Children and Youth?

We try to ensure that all information is visible in a variety of capacities such as the website, newsletters, meetings, etc. We are always looking for more innovative ways to teach our children so we want to make sure this message is clear to ensure our expectations are evident before hiring.

Recruitment and Retention: How does the school retain effective teachers? Identify any incentives.

We strive to recognize our teachers for their efforts in a variety of ways during the school year. This is an effort to remind others that greatness is celebrated. This is done through a monthly traveling trophy as well as various incentives during the year in areas such as attendance, test scores, etc. We also encourage teachers to take on PD and leadership roles as appropriate to allow the practicing teacher

voice to speak in ways that the administrative voice cannot.

Professional Learning: Identify supports, including mentoring and/or induction, provided to meet the needs of first year, inexperienced and out-of-field teachers.

We have a district level system designed to help new teachers and those new to the district adjust to their job. However, this consists of a few meetings a year as a total group and could be more effective to really meet the individual needs of our teachers as they start with our school system. This is an area that we need to be more intentional. As a school we need to put more of a focus on the needs of our first year teachers. We assign mentors but this can be more of a precise process to ensure needs are being met.

Professional Learning: Utilizing PGES data, how are the professional learning needs of teachers with an effectiveness rating below accomplished addressed?

Most are addressed through their specific professional learning goals. If a teacher has created a goal that is not addressing the area that is a concern based on PGES data, this is discussed during reflective conversations throughout the year. We offer PD at the school level as well as with our co-op as needed. We offer book studies and PD sessions to help when needed as well.

Working Conditions: How are TELL Kentucky results being addressed to increase recruitment, retention and professional learning needs of staff?

TELL survey results are shared with all staff members so that barriers can be addressed as a group. Committees are focused on the various needs including those addressed with the TELL survey to ensure a strong teacher voice in decision making. Teachers have outlets that can be used to express questions or concerns without requiring a name to be used as well as ensuring an open door policy so the atmosphere is one that is open and willing to work through concerns.
